This year, the event at Charlie Drake's will be a training session for chapter members who want experience as concorso judges, as was done last year. We hope that those who judged last year will come again for more experience and others will come to participate in this learning experience. This year it will be in May, the date to be determined later.

It was decided to have the Raduno in the fall this year. Harlan will work with DC Fiats to schedule the event.

Dave Holland led a discussion on Convention plans. Randy reported that a bank account for the convention funds has been set up and we have received over \$7600 in Convention registrations already. The second check for \$1000 has been mailed to the hotel. Bob Lubran is working on getting the PayPal account set up for on-line registration payment. [This was done by February 24 as reported in an email to Chapter members.]

Denny reported that the hotel is still working on getting a license to distribute alcohol outdoors and has said that the BBQ may end up being served from the Ballroom if the license is not gotten. The Town Hall may be

in the Ballroom as well. One thing still missing is a comprehensive list of all audio-visual requirements at the hotel so that bids may be requested. Discussed also was sponsorship, including a process for collecting monies from them. A sponsorship chair or coordinator is needed to provide one place that will track them. Alex has put forward Kathleen as sponsorship chair. Harlan is coordinating this effort and those with recommendations should send them to Harlan.

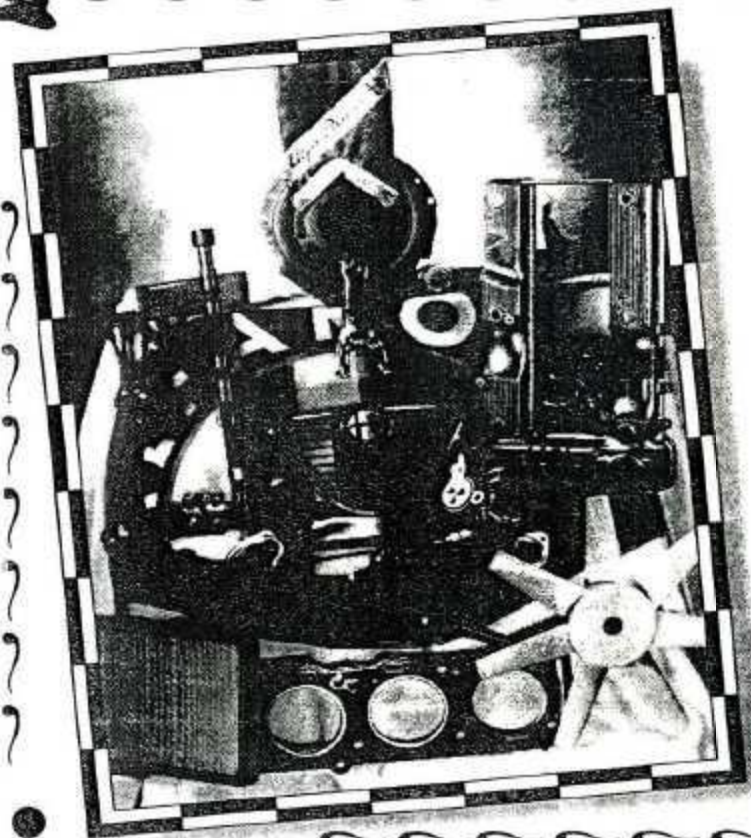

Turn left (West) onto Tuckerman Lane and go west on Tuckerman Lane past the traffic light at Gainsborough Road. Turn left onto Long Pine Trail. If you want to receive the voting email and you are only accepting approved senders, you will need to add arocvotes@kc.rr.com to your safe/approved list.

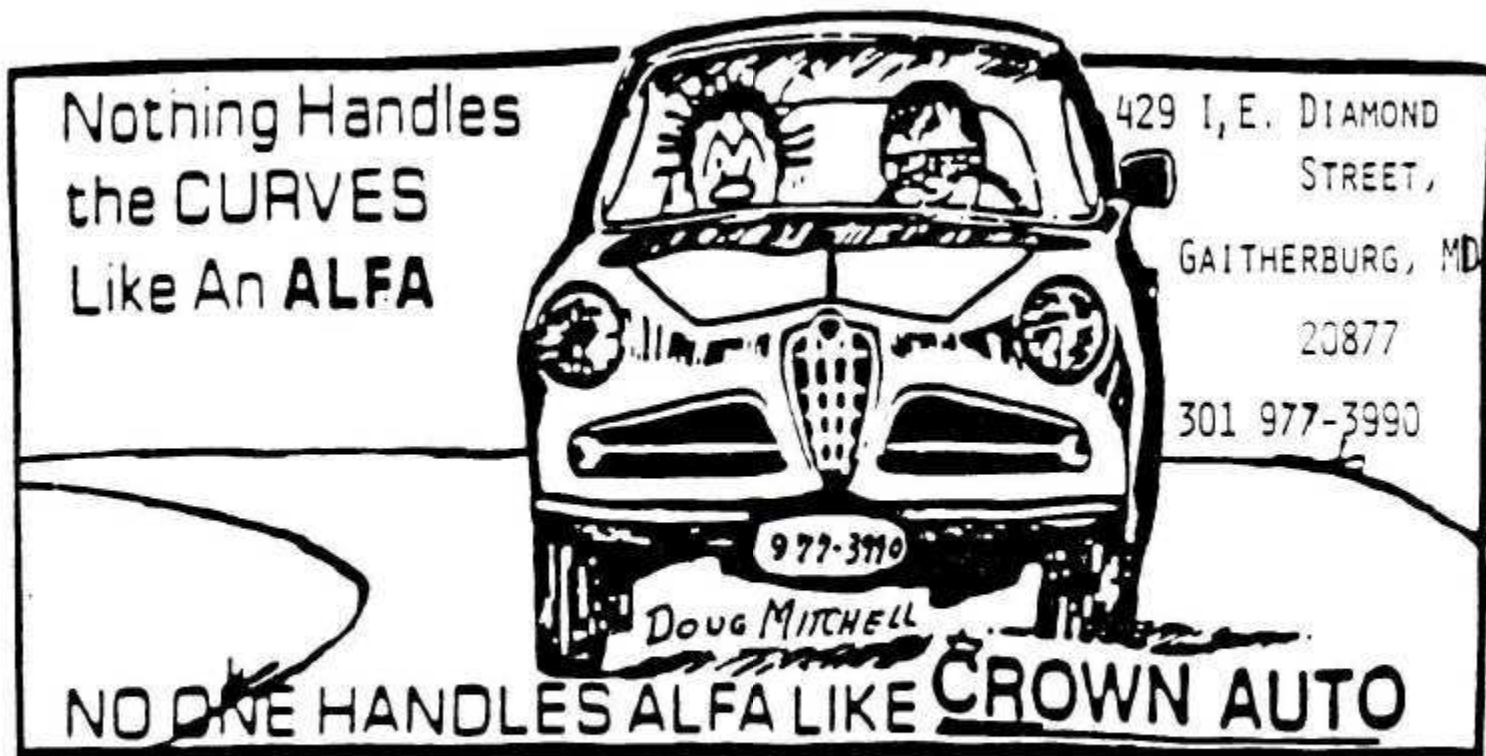

Alfa's US return likely for 2012, Marchionne says

Fiat's on-again, off-again plan to return Alfa Romeo to the United States is on again, this time with a target date of 2012.

A Chrysler Group spokesman has confirmed remarks made by CEO Sergio Marchionne in Toronto.

"I'm a lot more confident now that Alfa Romeo will reconstitute a product offering that is acceptable globally, and more in particular in the United States and Canada," Marchionne was quoted as saying Friday. "There is a strong likelihood that the brand will be back here within the next 24 months," press reports said.

Alfa exited the United States in 1995 with a reputation for poor quality.

A 2003 Alfa comeback was announced a decade ago as part of Fiat's alliance with General Motors. That partnership has been since dissolved, and subsequent statements from Fiat executives indicating a return haven't borne fruit.

Marchionne's latest view on Alfa's U.S. future follows last month's appointment of Harald Wester as the sports car maker's CEO. Wester, 51, is the fifth Alfa chief appointed by Marchionne during his six years at Fiat.

Wester added the Alfa job to a growing list of titles, which includes chief executive of Maserati and Abarth, as well as chief technical officer at Fiat S.p.A. and Fiat Group [Automobiles](#) S.p.A.

In appointing Wester, Marchionne called on his enormous commitment and a proven ability to "bring strong leadership capabilities and solid technical experience and know-how" to a strategic review of Alfa.

The review is due to be completed by April 21, when Fiat will unveil a plan for the group for the next four years.

Chrysler platforms

Sources say that Fiat is considering broadening Alfa's product portfolio using platforms from Chrysler Group, the U.S. automaker now controlled by Fiat through a 20 percent stake. Fiat bought Alfa in 1986.

The plan calls for using Fiat-Chrysler "compact-wide" architecture to underpin a front-drive [mid-sized sedan](#) and station wagon to replace the Europe-only 159.

The two new models, dubbed Giulia, would be built in the United States starting in mid-2012, the sources have said.

Alfa's future plans also include a rear-drive, large [sedan](#) based on the Chrysler 300C platform to replace the 166. This model, set to debut in 2013, may be built in Brampton, Ontario, along with the Chrysler 300C and Dodge Charger.

In Toronto, Marchionne indicated that Canada would play a major role in the future of Alfa and said production in the country was possible.

Alfa's newest product, the Giulietta hatchback to debut next month at the Geneva auto show to replace the 147, is not part of the current scenario for North America.

Alfa's new-car sales have declined steeply in the past decade as its range aged and new products were delayed.

Last year, Alfa's global sales declined 1 percent to 102,000 units, according to Fiat. That's about half the 203,000 units sold in 2000.

Marchionne spoke in advance of a Toronto charity event in support of earthquake relief for Abruzzo, Italy. Marchionne was born in Chieti, Abruzzo, and raised in Toronto.
